¹ Alageyik/Fallow Deer (Dama dama) existed in Anatolia since ancient times, from where it has spread the world. Alageyik currently faces extinction due to illegal hunting and industrialization; therefore, they were sheltered in the Dilek Peninsula National Park located in the Büyük Menderes Basin to create new habitat.

² Büyük Menderes Basin, defined by the Büyük Menderes River, is located in Western Anatolia covering ten cities, including the city of Aydın. Aydın is a half agricultural and half industrial city with high quality of fig, olive, and cotton production while hosting 85% of the Geothermal Power Plants in Turkey.

³ Smoke (hydrogen sulfide) gushes through the Geothermal Power Plant pipes of Aydın. Geothermal Power—assumed to be eco-friendly renewable energy production—could be hazardous to the environment when the extraction and the reinjection of the resource are not inspected as is due.

As she watched the vast areas of land that were summoning an extinction, her anxiety about this long journey was steadily disappearing. The reason for this reluctant escape was a collective struggle for survival, but she could not resist the growing excitement in the container towards the new destination.
